The **International Committee of the Red Cross** will stop administering the International Tracing Service but the Red Cross will continue to do Holocaust tracing. Searches are free and cases remain open so if new information becomes available, it is shared with the inquirer.

From the press release of the **International Tracing Service (ITS)**:

The **International Tracing Service (ITS)** in Bad Arolsen will expand its role and faces a change in management. The eleven-member International Commission that supervises the work of the ITS has initialled two new agreements on future tasks and administration which formally extend the tasks of the ITS into such areas as historical research, education, commemoration and cataloguing, thereby

enlarging the already existing main mandate of tracing. The German Federal Archives will become the new institutional partner as of January 1, 2013 to advise and work together with the International Commission and the director of the ITS in fields such as conservation and preservation; cataloguing and indexing; budgeting and auditing. The Director of the ITS will be appointed by the International Commission by unanimous decision. The International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) has announced its withdrawal from the management of the institution at the end of 2012. The Jerusalem of Lithuania – [New Online Exhibition](#)

On the eve of the Holocaust, the Jewish community of Vilna was the spiritual center of Eastern European Jewry, the center of enlightenment, political life, creativity. Known as "The Jerusalem of Lithuania," some 60,000 Jews lived in Vilna where they constituted 30% of the total population. This community, which had flourished for hundreds of years, was decimated during WWII. Yad Vashem's [YouTube channel in German](#) has joined the existing channels in English, Hebrew, Spanish, Russian, Arabic and Farsi. The German channel contains over 100 videos, including survivor testimonies, video lectures by German-speaking historians and archival footage, as well as a multimedia presentation on the Auschwitz Album. Related texts and resources about the Holocaust in German on Yad Vashem's website provide important historical context and background. It is anticipated that the German channel will be of great interest to the general public and an invaluable resource for German educators.

RESTITUTION

Germany has lifted the deadline for compensation for Holocaust survivors forcibly held in ghettos to apply for special compensation. **Ghetto survivors who have not yet applied to the Ghetto Fund or the Ghetto Pension should do so at once. There is no deadline to apply for the Ghetto Pension or the one-time award of €2,000 from the Ghetto Fund.** German BADV or ZRBG offices are contacting many potential claimants proactively to alert them to the change in the former exclusion clauses. The German government is also reviewing 56,000 previously rejected Ghetto Pension claims and will contact applicants if their claims are now accepted.
